

▪ System Requirements

Before installing the Wordbook Server, make sure your computer meets the requirements listed below.

- Power PC or Intel Macintosh with Wi-Fi
- MacOS X 10.4 or later
- "Wordbook" application for iPhone/iPod touch

▪ Installation

Drag and drop the Wordbook Server application to the "Applications" Folder or another preferred location on your harddisk.



Wordbook Server

Creating a Wordbook

To create a new Wordbook, click on the [+] button at the lower-left of the window. You can also select “Add Wordbook” from the “Wordbooks” menu.

An “Untitled” Wordbook will be added to the Wordbooks List in the left pane of the Wordbook Server window. To edit the Wordbook, select “Untitled”. The contents of the Wordbook will be displayed in the right pane.

If you want to delete the Wordbook, click on the [-] button at the lower-left of the window. You can also select “Delete Wordbook” in the “Wordbooks” menu.

Wordbook Information

Each wordbook contains the following information.

Title...This is the title of the wordbook. When you open this wordbook on an iPhone/iPod touch, the top card will display the title.

Instructions...This item gives users an idea of the objective of the Wordbook (e.g. “What is the Japanese word?” “What is the plural form?” “Fill in the blank”). This text will be shown when users open this wordbook on an iPhone/iPod touch. If you don’t want to show any instructions, leave this field blank.

Line Break...Set the line-break behavior for the iPhone/iPod touch. **Word Wrap** breaks lines by words. This is the recommended default for most Western languages. When you select **Character Wrap**, lines are broken within words. This is the standard for Japanese text. .

Card Color...Select the color of the cards. If you select none, the Card Color will be white.

Text Color...Select the color of the text. If you select none, the Text Color will be black.

Background Picture (Portrait/Landscape)...You can set your graphic files to be the background image behind the wordbook. Drag & drop your graphic files here to set the Background Picture.

Do not allow users to edit on iPhone/iPod...If this box is not checked, users can add/delete/edit cards on an iPhone/iPod touch. Check this box if you don’t want users to edit this wordbook.

Adding Cards to the Wordbook

To add a card to the wordbook, click on the [+] button at the bottom-center of the window, or select “Add Card” in the “Wordbook” menu. A New “Question/Answer” line will be added to the table of the center pane. One line for each card, with a question on the front and an answer on the back.

Double click in the “Question/Answer” fields to edit the text.

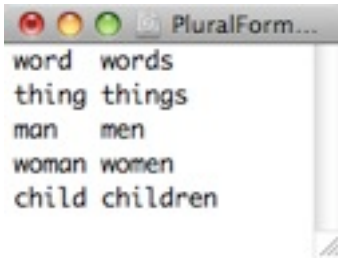
To delete a card, select the line to be deleted and click on the [-] button, or select “Delete Card” in the “Wordbook” menu.

Creating Wordbooks with a Text Editor

There is another way to create wordbooks, make a text database with your text editor or word processor, and then import it into Wordbook Server.

1. Make a text file with a text editor. The file should be saved as Tab Separated Text in the following format.

```
question1 [tab] answer1 [return]
question2 [tab] answer2 [return]
.....
```



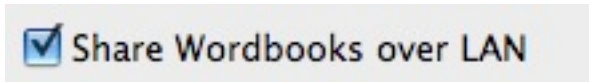
2. To import text files, drag & drop them to the list pane, or import them by selecting "Import">"Tab Separated Text" in the "File" Menu. If the files can't be imported, select the correct encoding in the "Text Encoding" area of the "Preferences" window. Supported encodings depend on the OS version.

*The maximum number of cards in a Wordbook is 1000. If it's exceeded, the remaining will be ignored.

Download Wordbooks from the Wordbook Server to an iPhone/iPod touch

Wordbooks can be downloaded from the Wordbook Server application to an iPhone/iPod touch.

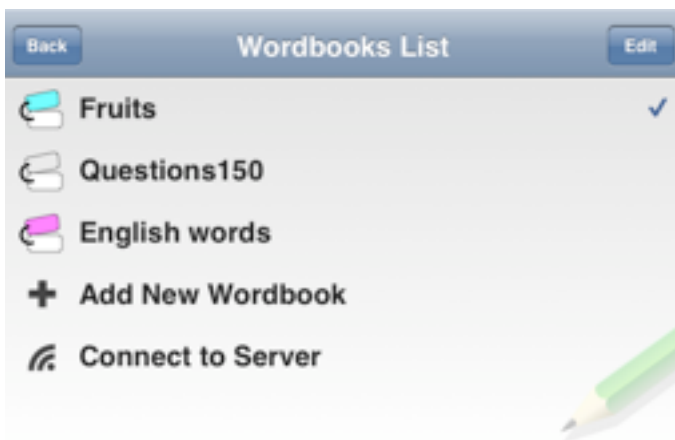
To make Wordbooks available, check the “Share Wordbooks over LAN” box at the top-left.



*When this is checked, any iPhone/iPod in the LAN can access the Wordbook Server.

Launch Wordbook on the iPhone/iPod touch and tap on the pencil to show the Wordbooks List.

Select “Connect to Server”.



The names of the computers running Wordbook Servers will be displayed.



If shared servers could not be found, the message “No server could be found” will be displayed.



Select and tap on the computer you want to connect to, and a list of shared wordbooks will be displayed. (* If the Mac has a Firewall set up, see “How to Set Up the Firewall” section.)

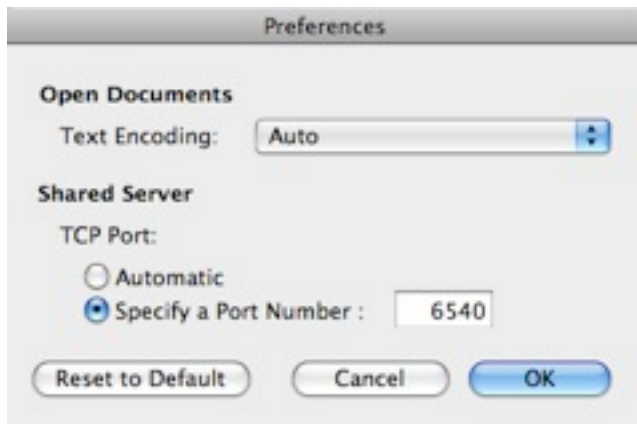


Select and tap the Wordbook in the list to start downloading. When finished, a message dialog will be shown. Select “Add” to use this Wordbook with the Wordbook application.

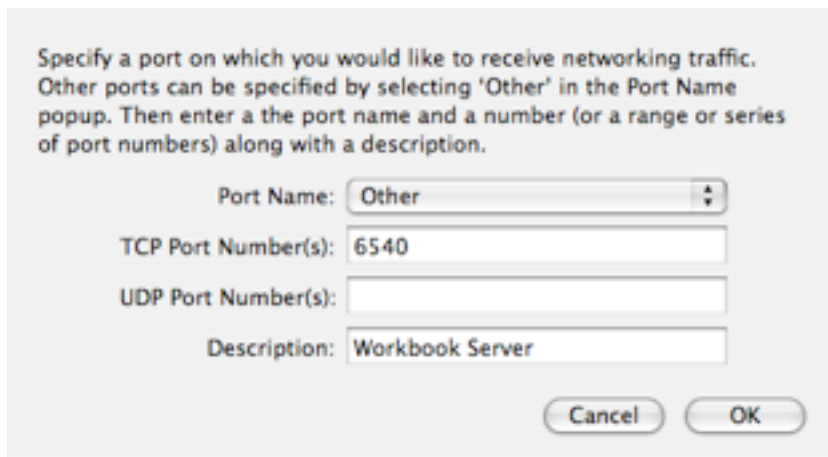


■How to Set Up the Firewall (for MacOS X 10.4)

Select “Preferences” in the Apple menu to open the Preferences window of Wordbook Server. Select “Specify a Port Number” in the Shared Server section and press “OK”.



Open “System Preferences” in the Apple menu and select the “Sharing” icon. In the Sharing window, go to the Firewall tab and click on the “New” button to specify the port to be used for the Wordbook Server. Set the port as follows and press “OK”.



■How to Set Up the Firewall (for MacOS X 10.5)

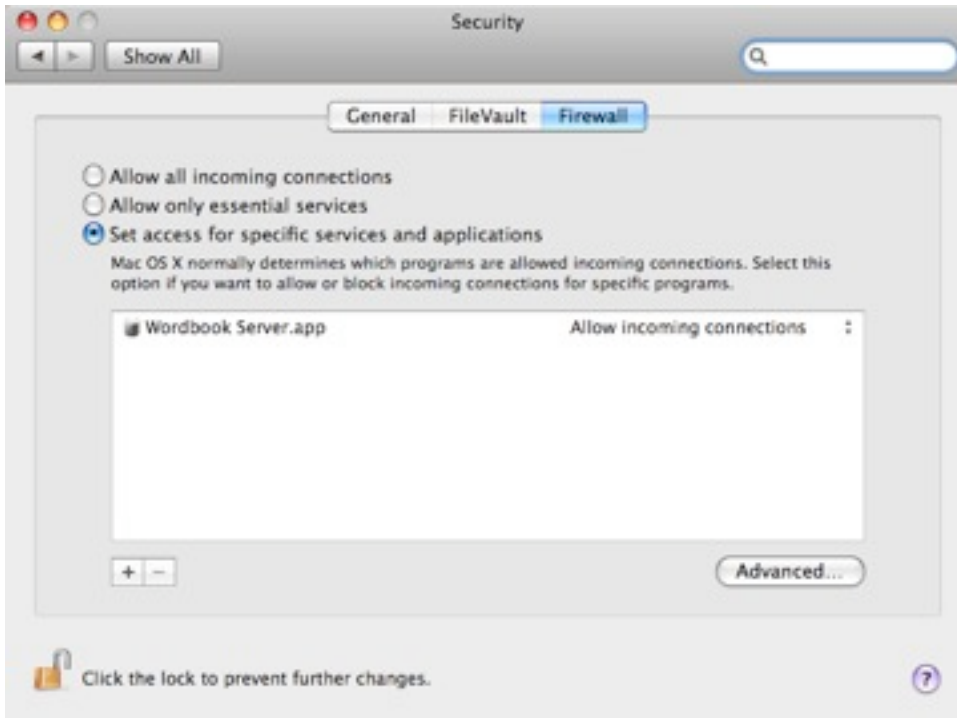
Open “System Preferences” in the Apple menu and select “Security”.

In the Security window, select the “Firewall” tab

Select “Set access for specific services and applications”.

Click on the [+] button and select the Wordbook Server application in the “File Dialog”.

Now Wordbook Server is added as an accesible application.



Exporting a Wordbook

If you select “Export” in the File menu, the file with the extension “.fcusu” will be created. This file can be downloaded and used in the Wordbook application on iPhone / iPod touch. Put this file on the internet (or LAN) server so that Wordbook applications can download.

■ Trouble Shooting

1. Can I use Wordbook Server without Wireless LAN ?

Even if you don't have Wireless LAN environment, your Wordbook application can access the Wordbook Server by setting up the Internet Sharing of Mac OS.

*As shown in the System Requirement section, AirPort or other Wi-Fi should be installed in the Macintosh running WordBook server.

Setting up the Internet Sharing (for Mac OS X 10.4)

1. Open System Preferences, and then click Sharing.
2. Remember "Computer Name". This will be used in later step.
3. Choose "Internet" tab.
4. Choose a network port from the "Share your connection from" pop-up menu.
5. Select "AirPort" from the "To computers using" list.
6. Click on the "Start" button.

Setting up the Internet Sharing (for Mac OS X 10.5)

1. Open System Preferences, and then click Sharing.
2. Remember "Computer Name". This will be used in later step.
3. Select "Internet Sharing" in the service list.
4. Choose a network service from the "Share your connection from" pop-up menu.
5. Select "AirPort" from the "To computers using" list.
6. Check the checkbox of "Internet Sharing" in the service list.

Setting up the iPhone / iPod

7. Launch "Settings" application and select "Wi-Fi".
8. Choose the name of Network used in step 2.

* If you choose the port which is connecting to the Internet at step 4, any computer with Wi-Fi enabled will be able to connect to the Internet through your Macintosh. There are several ways to prevent your Macintosh from being publicly shared :

- a) Stop Internet Sharing after using Wordbook Server.
- b) Set the password by clicking on AirPort Options in the Internet Sharing setting after step 5.

2. How can I get the Wordbook list on iPhone / iPod touch ?

Only the name of the computer can be seen, it seems.

If you use security softwares with your Mac, iPhone / iPod touch may not connect to your Mac. Please be careful to set your mac to be accessible in a LAN before using Wordbook server.
